Conformation Show Information

Puppy & Youth Classes

4-6 Month Male/Female - For all Rottweilers between the age of 4 and 6 months.

6-9 Month Male/Female - For all Rottweilers between the age of 6 and 9 months.

9-12 Month Male/Female - For all Rottweilers between the age of 9 and 12 months.

12-18 Month Male/Female - For all Rottweilers between the age of 12-18 months.

18-24 Month Male/Female - For all Rottweilers between the age of 18-24 months.

Adult Classes

Open Male /Female - For all Rottweilers 24 months and older without a USRC recognized Schutzhund or IPO title, Championship or USRC Sieger/Siegerin Title.

Champion Male/Female - For all Rottweilers 24 months and older who have earned a Championship. This includes AKC and CKC Champions, International FCI Champions and any champion of record from a country whose Championship was awarded by an FCI recognized kennel club. Those dogs entering the Champion class who are eligible to be awarded the USRC Sieger and Siegerin title must be USRC registered.

Working Male/Female - For all Rottweilers 24 months and older with a USRC recognized Schutzhund or IPO title who have not earned a USRC Sieger or Siegerin title. The dog must be USRC registered.

USRC Sieger/Siegerin Class - For all Rottweilers 24 months and older who have earned a Sieger or Siegerin title from a USRC National or Regional Show or have been awarded the USRC Universal Sieger or Siegerin title. Dogs eligible to enter the USRC Sieger or Siegerin class may not enter the Open, Champion or Working class; however, the dog may enter the Veteran Class if age permits.

Veteran Male/Female - For all Rottweilers 7 years or older on the day of the show. Veteran class entries are not eligible for titles and only receive critiques, no ratings or placements.

Non-Regular Classes ^{**} *Written critiques are not given in non-regular classes*

Kennel Group: Entered by the kennel owner. 3 or more dogs bred by the kennel owner and registered with the kennel name of the entrant. The kennel owner need not be the registered owner of the dogs. All dogs must first be registered in the show's regular classes.

Brood Bitch/Stud dog: Entered by the owner of the brood bitch/stud dog. The brood bitch/stud dog and at least two offspring must appear in the ring (*offspring must first be entered in regular classes*). The brood bitch/stud dog must have a USRC recognized breed test and have been at least 24 months of age at the time of breeding. The class is to be evaluated on the merits of the offspring. The owner of the brood bitch/stud dog need not be owner of the offspring.

Once a dog is eligible for the Champion, Working or Sieger/Siegerin class, the dog may not enter the Open Class. When a dog is eligible for more than one class, the dog's owner determines the entry. If a dog is eligible for the Sieger or Siegerin Class the dog may not be entered in any other class.

Additional Show Information

USRC Sieger/Siegerin Awards

Chosen from the eligible winners of the Champion, Working, Sieger/Siegerin and Veteran Classes. To be eligible to compete for Sieger or Siegerin title the dog must have:

- A valid USRC registration or must have applied for registration at the show.
- A minimum of a Schutzhund 1 or IPO 1 title.
- A valid USRC recognized Breed Test.
- A USRC recognized Hip Rating.
- Receive a V1 rating in their respective class on the day of the show.

The judge will select the winner from the eligible dogs. If there are no dogs that meet the requirements for the Sieger/Siegerin title, no dogs will be brought into the show ring and no title will be awarded. The judge may withhold placements or titles at their discretion.

USRC Select Adult Male/Female Awards

Winners from the Working and Champion classes, who are not eligible for the Sieger or Siegerin titles, will compete along with the winner of the Open Class for USRC Select Male/Female Awards. The judge will select the winner from the eligible dogs. If there are no dogs that meet the requirements for the Select Male/Female Awards, no dogs will be brought into the show ring and no title will be awarded. The judge may withhold placements or titles at their discretion.

Entry Rules

- Photocopies of support documents for all titles and accomplishments MUST be sent with the entry, original documents must be available for inspection at the show.
- Effective January 1, 2006, all dogs entered in USRC sanctioned events who are 30 months of age and older must possess a USRC recognized hip certification, whether pass or fail. Dogs that do not meet these requirements will not be permitted to enter.
- No dogs shall be permitted to enter with missing teeth. Dogs entered that are found to have missing teeth will be dismissed from the ring and will not be critiqued.
- Dogs born after 6/1/1999 in countries with anti-docking laws must be shown with a natural tail.
- Dogs are shown in natural stance, no hand stacking allowed. Double handling is permitted.
- Dogs must be baited from outside the ring. Absolutely no food is allowed in or outside of the ring or for baiting purposes. *Handlers or owners found to be using food to bait will be immediately asked to leave the ring area and will forfeit any entry fees, placements, titles, awards, etc.*
- Adult classes will be moved (run) long enough for the judge to evaluate the dog's movement and fitness.
- At no time will handlers, runners, owners or spectators interfere with the judge or otherwise hinder their ability to assess the dogs being presented to them in the ring. This includes the final baiting phase. One warning will be issued. If a second instance occurs, the offender will be asked to leave the ring area and will forfeit any entry fees, placements, titles, awards, etc.

USRC Breed Suitability Test

The USRC Breed Suitability Test (BST) was designed to determine if a Rottweiler possess the necessary qualities to be used in a breeding program and the US gene pool. USRC strongly believes that breed tests, are vital to maintaining the Rottweiler in type, temperament, form and function. There are two parts to the BST. The first part evaluates conformation and structure using the FCI breed standard. The dog is measured, weighed, critiqued and moved to ensure that it possesses no structural or disqualifying faults. The second part is a temperament test. Tests in this phase include indifference to gunshots and for composure while moving within a group of people. The dog must also complete a protection test, which includes defense of the handler and a courage test.

USRC BSTs are judged by qualified USRC and international judges. A written critique of the BST is provided to the owner and also is reported in the annual USRC Breed Book. The BST also appears on the USRC pedigree of any progeny that the dog may produce. USRC offers the Breed Suitability Test (BST) at all Full Member Club Shows.

BST Requirements:

- Owner, co-owner (if applicable) and handler must be USRC members
- Dog must be registered with USRC
- Dog must be at least 18 months of age
- Dog must have a tattoo for identification purposes
- Dog must have a weight certificate from a vet dated within 30 days of the test
- Dogs must have a USRC recognized hip certification

The following documents MUST be submitted with BST entry:

- Copy of USRC Membership Card for owner(s) co-owner (if applicable) & handler
- Copy of USRC Registration for the dog being entered
- Copy of Scorebook showing titles earned, scorebook number and full name of dog**
- Copy of document showing prior BST attempts, if any
- Copy of USRC recognized Hip Certification
- Copy of a weight certificate from a Vet within 30 days of test date

USRC Breed Suitability Test

Critique and Temperament Test

Dogs will be weighed, measured and critiqued. Dogs should be well trained in presentation for weighing and measuring. The tattoo or microchip number will be checked and read out loud as part of the critique. The handler and dog on leash walk through a group of five to eight people. The handler and dog return to the center of the group where the dog sits. The group, when instructed by the judge, converges on the dog. The dog and handler and remain there until told by the judge to disperse. The handler and dog heel away from the judge. At a distance of fifteen paces, a 22 short blank starter pistol or its equivalent, will be fired twice with a short interval in between each shot. Should the dog show a reaction to the gunfire, this exercise may be varied and repeated at the judge's discretion. If the dog continues to show a strong reaction to gunfire, the test will be stopped and the dog is deemed unbreedable.

BST Performance Routine

With the dog on leash, the handler reports to the judge. The dog's tattoo or microchip number will be rechecked by the judge before the protection work begins. On instruction from the judge the dog and handler approach the blind on leash. At a distance of approximately 30 feet away from the blind the handler will remove the dog's leash and continue approaching the blind while holding the dog by the collar. At approximately 12 feet from the blind (a line may be marked on the ground) the judge will instruct the helper to come out of the blind and attack the handler. The handler must immediately release the dog and remain at the spot of releasing the dog until told otherwise by the judge. The helper will come out immediately from the blind when directed by the judge and attack towards the handler. The helper will catch the dog on the sleeve, drive the dog and apply two stick hits with an interval of 2 or 3 steps between hits. The helper will continue to drive the dog briefly, approximately 3 to 5 paces, until directed by the judge to stop. The dog should immediately go to the helper and grip the sleeve and continue gripping the sleeve while being driven. When the helper stops, the dog outs, with or without command from the handler. The dog must guard the helper intently. On instruction from the judge the handler will go to the dog and put the dog on the leash. The handler, with the dog on leash, will heel down the field to a blind designated by the judge. On instruction from the judge the handler will leave the blind (on leash) and heel to the center of the field. With the dog in the basic position, the handler will remove the leash and hold the dog by the collar. The dog must remain quietly by the handler's side.

On instruction of the judge, the helper will come from behind a blind that is designated by the judge (approximately 40 meters away from the dog and handler) and walk at a normal pace to the center of the field. The handler may challenge the helper as he leaves the blind. At the center of the field the helper will turn and run towards the dog and handler in a threatening manner. The handler will release the dog and remain at the spot of releasing the dog until told otherwise by the judge. The helper will catch the dog on the sleeve and drive the dog 4 or 5 paces (no stick hits). The dog must grip and remain on the sleeve while being driven. The helper stops and the dog outs, with or without a command from the handler. The dog must guard the helper intently. When instructed by the judge, the handler will go to the dog, put the dog on leash, heel back to the judge and report that the routine is completed.

Canine Good Citizen Test

Started in 1989, the American Kennel Club Canine Good Citizen is a certification program that is designed to reward dogs who have good manners at home and in the community. The Canine Good Citizen Program is a two-part program that stresses responsible pet ownership for owners and basic good manners for dogs. All dogs who pass the 10-step CGC test may receive a certificate from the American Kennel Club.

Many dog owners choose Canine Good Citizen training as the first step in training their dogs. As owners work with their dogs to teach the CGC skills, they discover the many benefits and joys of training their dog. Dogs who have a solid obedience education are a joy to live with—they respond well to household routines, have good manners in the presence of people and other dogs, and they fully enjoy the company of the owner who took the time to provide training, intellectual stimulation, and a high quality life.

Many other countries (including England, Australia, Japan, Hungary, Denmark, Sweden, Canada, and Finland) have developed CGC programs based on the AKC's CGC Program. A CGC Neighborhood Model has been established, police and animal control agencies use CGC for dealing with dog problems in communities, some therapy dog groups use the CGC as a partial screening tool, and some 4-H groups around the country have been using the CGC as a beginning dog training program for children. Veterinarians have recognized the benefits of well-trained dogs and there are some CGC programs in place in veterinary hospitals. State legislatures began recognizing the CGC program as a means of advocating responsible dog ownership and 22 states now have Canine Good Citizen resolutions.

Who Can Participate?

All dogs, including both purebred and mixed breed dogs are welcome to participate in the AKC's Canine Good Citizen® (CGC) Program. Dogs must be old enough to have received necessary immunizations such as rabies vaccines. Owners will sign the Responsible Dog Owners Pledge attesting to having the dog under the routine care of a veterinarian who will work with the owner to determine an appropriate plan and schedule for vaccines and other health care procedures.

There is no age limit for the CGC test. A dog is never too old to be a good citizen. Puppies who have completed all immunizations and boosters may be tested, however, because we know that behavior and temperament can change over time, when puppies pass the CGC test, owners should have them re-tested as adults.

Directions To The Show Site...

From the Host Hotel:

Approximate Distance: 23 MI / Approximate Driving Time: 30 minutes

Go East on PA-10 (Cherry St). Take I-76 (PA Turnpike) ramp on right (toll required for some segments. Take I-76 E (Philadelphia, Exits 32-39) ramp on left. Take Exit 312 (PA-100, Pottstown, West Chester) on right. Take Downingtown Interchange ramp (*toll required for some segments*). Take PA-100 South (Downingtown) ramp. Continue onto PA-100 (N Pottstown Pike) . Bear left onto PA-113 (E Uwchlan Av). Follow PA-113. Turn left at flashing traffic light (Firehouse Lane) and signs for show. There is a printing company (Rowlands) right across the street from Firehouse Lane.

From the East:

From New Jersey: PA Turnpike West to Exit 326 (Valley Forge). Go through toll plaza and take first exit on right (Valley Forge). Follow to Route 23 (approx 4 lights). Route 23 West through Valley Forge Park and Phoenixville. Left on Route 113 South (McDonalds on Right). Follow approximately 1.5 miles, Fairgrounds are on the right.
